SUPPLEMENTARY GUIDELINES ON THE CONDUCT KNOWLEDGE, ATTITUDE AND PRACTICE (KAP) SURVEY UNDER THE SOCIAL MARKETING AND MOBILIZATION COMPONENT OF THE COASTAL AND MARINE ECOSYSTEMS MANAGEMENT PROGRAM (CMEMP)

OPERATIONAL DEFINITION OF TERMS

- Local Chief Executives/Barangay Officials—elected barangay officials:
 - a. Punong Barangay;
 - b. Sangguniang Barangay Members;
 - c. Barangay Secretary; and
 - d. Barangay Treasurer.
- 2. Household heads usually the fishermen.
- 3. Local organization members members of Peoples Organization's present in the area.
- 4. Youth/students (15-24 years old) 5% Out-of-School Youth (OSY) and 5% students or completely 10% OSY or 10% students.
- 5. Local business owners Business operators in the barangay.
- 6. School heads/teachers School heads/teachers in the particular schools within the barangay whether elementary, secondary or tertiary.

OBJECTIVES OF THE KAP SURVEY

The following are the objectives of the survey:

- 1. Examine the perception of the stakeholders on what is Biodiversity, Marine Pollution and Climate Change;
- 2. Determine the prevailing knowledge, attitudes and practices of stakeholders relative to the specific coastal and marine ecosystems (mudflat areas, mangrove forests, seagrass meadows, and coral reefs); and
- 3. Identify the different communication channels that are being used/accessed by the stakeholders.

SAMPLING DESIGN/METHODOLOGY

Sampling Frame

Identify the population of the local chief executives/barangay officials, household heads, local organization members, youths/students, local business owners, and school heads/teachers preferably in all the barangays within the NIPAS Marine Protected Areas. The population listings (barangay/municipality records or PSA website) should be exclusive, that is, each target respondent should be included in only one of the six categories. Each list will serve as sampling frame for each category in each MPA locality. In case the list is not available, the approximated totality in each barangay should be determined.

Once the listings are obtained, 10% of the totality in each category in each barangay within the MPA shall be considered for interview. Every interview is expected to be complete and correct.

Determining the Person to be Included in the Survey

In cases that a respondent qualifies to two or more of the categories, he/she will be counted under one category only. A respondent is said to be eligible for interview if he/she is physically present at the time of interview and consents to participate.

If one or two categories is/are not available in the survey locale (barangay) in the preliminary sampling list considering that all the available population listings were retrieved, then the enumerator/s can disregard those categories and proceed with the remaining categories of interest.

The number of respondents to be interviewed should not be less than the target sample size in each category per barangay. Moreover, the CMEMP implementers may opt to increase the target minimum percentage subject to availability of resources (funds, manpower, time).

An interview is said to be complete if all the details needed have valid responses.

Replacement of Respondents

If the available respondent refused to be interviewed or there is no response from the respondent after two attempts of scheduled interview, the respondent will be substituted by another person not yet interviewed but falls under the same category.

DATA COLLECTION

Enumerators will be trained for data gathering and interview. Data validators will check for errors and incomplete responses in the questionnaire. In case of errors and incomplete responses, the enumerator will have to do a second visit to the respondents to complete the interview. It is advised that data validators will be different from enumerators. Data consolidators will consolidate the data gathered during the duration of the survey.

DATA TRIANGULATION

To validate and ensure accuracy of data interpretation and analysis, the CMEMP implementers <u>may</u> conduct Key Informant Interviews (KII) and Focused Group Discussions (FGDs) among the following:

KII:

- 1. Municipal Mayor or Municipal Environment and Natural Resources Officer/Municipal Agriculture Officer/Municipal Planning and Development Officer
- 2. Member/s of the Indigenous Peoples Group
- 3. One representative from local business group

FGD:

- 1. Wives of Fishermen
- 2. Local Business Owners (medium or small-scale)
- 3. Local Organization Members
- 4. Out of School Youth/Students (15 to 24 years old)
- 5. Fishermen
- 6. Teachers

Any alternative methodologies and survey instruments suited to the locale (barangay) are encouraged provided that these satisfy the objectives of the KAP Survey. Such alternative/s should be properly defined in the KAP Survey Report.

DATA PROCESSING AND ANALYSIS

Collected data from completed interviews will be encoded in the annexed (ANNEX 1) spreadsheet file, KAP Data Analysis Template. Use the KAP Reference Guide in Inputting Data (ANNEX 2) as guide in encoding the values.

Simple descriptive analysis will be employed in interpreting the data gathered using pivot table, pie graphs, bar charts, average and percentages will be used for the analysis. These results can be generated using Microsoft Excel.

The CMEMP implementers can employ other statistical techniques/tools for in-depth analysis provided that resources are available and that such additional intervention/s can fit within the budget given.

SUBMISSION OF DATA AND REPORTS

All KAP Survey encoded raw data and final reports (with analysis) should be submitted to BMB.

SURVEY REPORT FRAMEWORK

The following are the prescribed sections of the report:

- 1. **Introduction** this will cover brief description of the conduct of the survey before, during and after.
- 2. Objectives this is basically the objectives of the survey as outlined in the earlier part of this guideline. Additional specific objectives that may have identified at the regional level, appropriate to the locality can likewise be reflected in this section.
- 3. Survey Methodology this section describes all activities undertaken for the KAP Survey. This is also the part where other methodologies used can be explained per the unique nature of each of the locales (barangays) where the KAP surveys were conducted.

4. Results – this contains strictly the processed results of the survey organized in tables, graphs and a narrative portion for the answers to the open-ended questions and other sections as appropriate.

No commentaries yet on this section but only a thorough description of the locale, sampling frame (actual number of respondents and demographic characteristics/profile) and each of the contents of the tables, graphs and other figures/representations.

5. Discussion – this is where the significant results are highlighted in relation to the objectives of the survey. Moreover, this is the section where the limitations of the survey and local situation/context can be elucidated to support the interpretation and analysis of results. Hlustrations such as diagrams and other infographics can be used to explain the results.

All field personnel and focal staff knowledgeable of the actual conduct of the survey must be involved in the analysis of data/results.

- 6. Recommendations and Conclusions This section highlights the most significant information based on the analysis of the results. This can now point to the next steps toward the possible activities and strategies of CMEMP particularly for the respective regional/NIPAS MPA level communication campaigns nationwide. Further/follow-up activities can be listed here as necessary for the overall achievement of the goal of CMEMP that can be achieved largely through effective communication interventions.
- 7. Reference/s List of related literature/publications that may have been used or served as reference/s in the actual conduct of the survey and/or in writing the report.
- 8. Appendix(es) This is where all comprehensive tables and figures supporting the information presented on all report sections particularly discussion/analysis of results can be attached.


